



Our Year in Review

The 2016/17 Financial Year was a year of new experiences, a year of many changes and a year of program expansion, but most importantly, it was a year of fun!

1249 young people attended over 54 camps
128 were young indigenous children (88 from
interstate as part of the Cathy Freeman Foundation
Horizons Program)

30 children from various special needs schools70 children from English Second Language Schools

221 children brought up soley by grandparents80 students from Yuille Park and Operation NewStart Programs

Various familes going through hard times enjoyed a special break at our Riptide Cottage
In addition to this, hundreds more participated in our community groups, hospitality and school hire programs.



The Year to Come

Cottage by the Sea is always striving to increase the number of children we assist annually and to build upon their camp experience. In order to do this though, we are required to make a number of upgrades to our 80 year-old building to comply with government standards. These changes are necessary to the future growth of the organisation and form the basis of our newly launched Capital Appeal: Inspired Futures. The projects within the appeal are outlined below.

Fire services upgrade
Accessibility upgrades
Major access works
Restoration works
A new 24 seater bus



Alongside this, Cottage by the Sea is undertaking an external organisational review so as to help us continue to deliver an exceptional support service for children in the years to come.

We have many exciting ideas for improving our camps over the coming year, in particular within the REEF and Mentor programs. These ideas are aimed at not only improving the camp experience of the participants, but also the outcomes of the camp.

Our involvement with the Cathy Freeman Foundation's Horizons program is also set to grow. We are fortunate to be invited to be involved in a greater number of camps per year. These camps are largely run by Cottage by the Sea staff and take place in capital cities around Australia.

We are excited for what the coming year holds and look foward to continue building positive relationships with the community, supporters, donors and kids we work with.



It's been a busy year for our Take a Break program with over 37 camps taking place and 882 primary aged children walking through the Cottage doors.

The Take a Break program is the most common program on offer at the Cottage. Children are often in grades 3-6 and stay at the Cottage for up to 5 days. The program emphasises co-operation and respect and encourages children to be healthy, active, happy and secure.

Children are usually referred by school welfare officers, welfare agencies, government health departments or council services.

This year the Take a Break Program made some great new connections in the Loddon Mallee region and Kyabram Family Services. The 11 children from the Kyabram area made the long bus trip to Cottage by the Sea and enjoyed a



3-day stay at our Riptide Cottage. Many children who participated on this camp had never seen the beach, making it an amazing experience to share with them.

The children that are chosen to participate in the Take a Break program are selected for a range of reasons. Often they are affected in some way by any of the following; family breakdown and/or dysfunction, domestic violence, emotional/physical trauma, social/economic disadvantage, living in poverty, cultural disadvantage, refugee status, lack of educational opportunities, or even a combination of these.

Throughout a Take a Break camp the children participate in activities such as swimming, surfing, rock pooling, initiative games and visits to Point Lonsdale, Marine Discovery Centre, local playgrounds and the Queenscliff Marina.



The REEF program is a two-year program that assists young people in the transition from primary school to secondary school and is a predecessor to our Mentor program. REEF stands for, Recreation, Education, Environment and Friendship and that is what the program centres on.

There were many exciting opportunities offered to our first year REEF participants from Leopold and our second year REEF participants from St Albans over the last year. Unsurprisingly, the favourite camps were those hosted offsite and designed to allow the young people to try new experiences and step outside their comfort zone.

The Leopold REEF participants were treated to their first offsite camp, camping at Cumberland River along the Great Ocean Road. The young people were required to set up and sleep in tents and cook their own meals on Trangia Stoves. During the week the kids had the opportunity to explore the natural beauty of the Great Ocean Road. They went on bush walks to majestic waterfalls, swam in clear blue beaches and visited the nearby coastal town, Lorne. Being exposed to these new experiences was an eye opener for many of the participants and it helped to them to



become more confident amongst their peers.

The second year REEF participants from the St Albans area had many exciting moments in what was their graduating year, the highlight being the annual snow camp at Mt Buller. On this camp the young people are given the opportunity to learn to snowboard over five days. The camp teaches the participants to be resilient, persistent and determined to achieve their goals. The feedback from the young people always tells us that is is the hardest, but the most fun camp in the program.

In December, the same second year REEF participants graduated from the program. At the ceremony, hosted at the Cottage, each of the young people stepped on stage to say a few words about their time in the program. The graduation ceremony was attended by the family and guardians of young people, all of who were invited to stay for lunch and to meet the Cottage staff. The graduates have since gone on to join our Mentor program.



Cottage by the Sea is lucky to have a contingent of fantastic young people who commit their time on a regular basis to contribute to the Cottage in the role of Mentor. The Mentors are graduates of the REEF Program who chose to stay involved throughout years 8 – 12 of their schooling, attending camps, fundraising events, training and volunteering opportunities. This year has been a busy one with 70 Mentors participating. With so many young people remaining engaged in the program, there were many highlights.

10 Mentor camps were scheduled across the financial year. The young people return to the Cottage for camps both onsite and offsite, catching up with great friends and caring staff.

So as to maintain regular contact with the Mentor participants, "Home Town Dinners" were established this year. Cottage by the Sea staff visit Mentors in their home town and share a meal at a local restaurant. It is a great way to catch up with the young people in-between camps.

The Year 9 Mentors are invited to represent the Cottage on a tour of Sydney. The camp involved meeting and climbing the bridge with staff from Massachusetts Financial Group who fund the experience. The young people are



given the chance to explore the city – planning their activities, meals and transport as a group. The trip provides a unique opportunity that fosters independence and sparks interest and ambition for the participants.

The Anderson Family, APCO service station founders, invite Mentors to camp on their beautiful property on the Edward River at Moulamein once a year. The family generously volunteer their time and share their love of the great outdoors with our young people, teaching them a range of camping and bush skills that so few kids get to experience these days.

In a partnership that has grown over many years, our Mentors have the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to attend a 10-day program at Mittagundi, a pioneering style camp in the Victorian High Country.

Alongside all of these amazing camp opportunities, many Mentors volunteer for the Cottage at events throughout the year. Many offered to assist at our busy Annual Fair. They welcomed guests at the gate, made coffee and food, served donuts and assisted with the clean up.



The Cottage by the Sea National program has evolved into a strong relationship with the Cathy Freeman Foundation. Cottage by the Sea works within the Cathy Freeman Foundation's Horizons program, a program that is designed according to the age group which ranges from Year 5 to Year 12, and balances fun and new experiences of city life with educational opportunities focused on positive mentoring and goal setting. The trips for secondary school students are focused on post school pathways. The Cottage was proud to work on an additional two camps this year, resulting in six camps for our National program.

The Indigenous students who are selected for these camps come from four remote communities - Palm Island, Woorabinda, Elko Island and Tiwi Islands. The students are chosen on their academic achievements and attendance at school. The Horizons camps take place in the major cities of Australia (Sydney, Canberra, Melbourne, Brisbane and Darwin) to challenge the students to step out of their comfort zones and prepare them for what the future brings. At the end of each camp the students use all the knowledge and skills they have learnt on the camp to make a presentation to the group about their dreams and goals for the future.



Each camp is designed with educational benefits alongside many fun activities. Some of the highlights over the past 12 months include:

Leading The Long Walk with Michael Long to the Dreamtime at the MCG Climbing the Sydney Harbour Bridge on sunset and seeing the amazing view over the city Meeting the Prime Minister of Australia Malcolm Turnbull on our tour of Parliament House The inspiring sessions with Cathy Freeman herself

Cottage by the Sea is extremely proud of the achievements from every student who attends the Horizons Camps and we look forward to continuing our partnership with the Cathy Freeman Foundation.

General Manager and President's Report

Over the past year, Cottage by the Sea has been working hard across the board to provide the best possible inspiration, fun and opportunity experience for the 1,300 plus children involved in our programs. Through our REEF and Mentor programs, our early intervention model delivers significant, sustainable benefits and positive returns for those involved.

During the year the Board and Management Team continued to ensure strong financial management which is so critical given the tough economic and political environment. The team have worked hard to increase revenues and build a strong diversified income base so we can continue to support the ever growing demand for our services for young people in need.

We would like to honour Chris Coakes who retired from the board after 18 years of exceptional service to our charity. Our board was further strengthened during the year with the appointment of Jerome Walsh to the board while our staff team gained the services of Andrew Balaam in a special projects/advisor capacity.

Providing strong governance, wise counsel and informed thinking are critical factors for boards these days, to this end the board is about to launch into a better governance accreditation program. We will also review our structure and operations ahead of strategic planning for the next 3 to 5 years. The review will focus on the organisation's internal capacity to deliver current and future services. Apart from other obvious benefits, this approach will ensure we are best placed to embark on further program expansion.

This year we invited Equal Access Victoria, Geelong Fire Services, Kandu Property Consulting and Deakin University Consulting to review our current building and associated services. They found that our eighty year old building must be upgraded to meet fire safety services requirements and building accessibility needs. In particular, the Cottage is not presently suited to accommodate those with physical challenges, which may not be surprising given the age of the building, but is plainly unsatisfactory.

This has led to our Access and Safety Project, an



important project aimed at improving the main Cottage building. Capital works will include installation of a lift and new amenities for access along with enhanced protection systems for fire safety.

We are very pleased to report that the capital building appeal has resonated with our donor base. Accordingly, this year the Cottage has generated a surplus largely consisting of tagged funds for the Access and Safety Project. We are confident now that it can be delivered.

Such capital fundraising campaigns are essential from time to time as the Cottage receives no government funding. We rely heavily on the generosity of individuals, trusts, foundations, community groups and organisations to fund all our programs. We are so grateful that our donors are assisting the Cottage building to be of an appropriate standard to meet the needs of our children, employees, volunteers and visitors in the 21st Century.

Thank you to our volunteers, branches, ambassadors, donors and supporters who together with our talented staff team at the Cottage made such a difference to hundreds of children and young people's lives.
